### **Dissecting Dr. Christopher South**

Christopher South, Ph.D., started his teaching career at Chamois High School in 2020. He teaches all junior-high and high-school science classes.

Earlier this month, South had students in Biology and Anatomy classes dissect frogs, bringing back a lab experience that hasn't happened in years. Senior Anatomy student Alex McKague said, "It was a new experience that was really interesting and fun to do with my friends in Biology II."

South's favorite area of science to teach and work with is chemistry, and he holds a Ph.D. in physical chemistry from the University of North Texas. He says that chemistry is special to him because he "...likes to see how everything fits together to make the substances that we tend to take for granted."

In addition to his Ph.D., South has a master's degree in math and a bachelor's in

chemistry, both from Texas Christian University. Eventually, he hopes to teach Computational Chemistry with assistance from Computer Teacher Jim Wiegand.

Growing up, South lived in a variety of places. He was born in Texas and has lived in Colorado, Michigan, and Missouri. In graduate school, he worked on a research project in France after receiving a grant to work with a collaborator he had met at his university. South said, "France was a really nice country to visit, and it was a great opportunity to work there."

When he's not teaching students or dissecting frogs, South likes to play video games on his PC and Nintendo Switch, or watch an occasional movie. He also enjoys spending time with his gray tabby cat, Ken, who's favorite food is turkey.

The Christmas Concert and Art Show is at 3 p.m., Sunday, Dec. 4, in the gym.




